Monthly payments have become a way of life. Easy credit. Buy now, pay later.

American economists are concerned about the immense debt load. Many young couples get so far into debt it is almost impossible to get out.

I've had my share of those monthly obligations. What a relief to come to that last payment and write across the bottom of the check, "Final Payment" or "Paid in Full."

Archeologists have found many tax receipts from early centuries with the Latin *consummatum est* scrawled across them. It means paid.

The Greek equivalent is *tetelestai*. This is the word Jesus spoke from the Cross when he bowed his head and gave up his spirit. *Tetelestai* – "It is finished." He had come into the world to seek and save the lost. This was the climax of that mission.
